

# Saint of the Month: Saint Teresa of Avila



When Teresa was 20 she entered a Carmelite convent that had become very lax. She was fine with this for eighteen years, but then felt called to a deeper prayer life and to begin a reformed branch of the order known as the "Shoeless" Carmelites. In 1970 Blessed Paul VI named her Doctor of the Church.

Saint Teresa of Jesus was a great contemplative who understood well that "the reason for prayer is the birth always of good works." "Let us understand", she wrote, "that true perfection consists in love of God and neighbor."


One translation of a poem she wrote about the Body of Christ goes: "Christ has no body now on earth but yours, no hands but yours, no feet but yours; yours are the eyes through which he looks with compassion on the world, yours are the feet with which he is to go about doing good, and yours are the hands with which he blesses all the world."

She also wrote the following verse: "Let nothing disturb you. Let nothing make you afraid. All things are passing. God alone never changes. Patience gains all things. If you have God you will want for nothing. God alone suffices."


