#### SAINT OF THE MONTH



St. Catherine is one of the most unusual and important women in history. St. Catherine was the youngest of 25 children. Drawn to a life of prayer, she received her first vision of Jesus when she was only six. She joined the lay Dominicans, devoted herself to prayer and works of charity, and prevailed upon the Pope to leave Avignon in France and return to Rome. A terrible schism soon developed. She offered her life for the Church's healing and died when she was 33. In 1970 Blessed Paul VI named her and Saint Teresa of Avila the first female Doctors of the Church.

## THE CAPITOL: March 18-19


